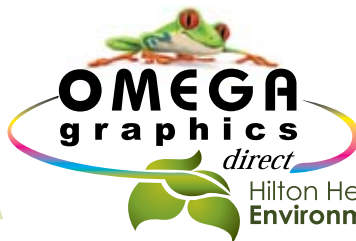

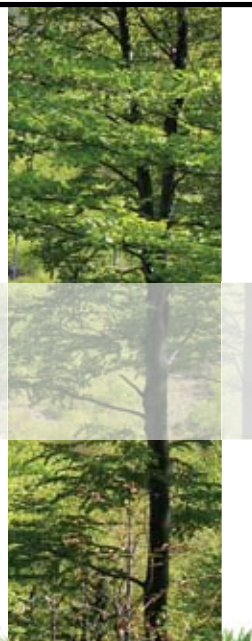

Students and teachers benefit every day thanks to the generosity of Project Connect donors. By connecting community businesses and individuals with teachers and their “wish lists,” the program gives everyone an opportunity to support education.

Teacher lists are published weekly in *The Island Packet*, along with “wishes granted.” But the benefits go far beyond, according to educators like Colleen Wynne, 2009 Sue West Educator of the Year recipient who talks about Project Connect and how parents can get their student off to a great start for school.

Q: How do programs such as Project Connect help teachers in the classroom?

A: Project Connect helps by highlighting the many and varied needs of teachers as they reach to provide for the children they teach on a daily basis. I think one of the strongest impacts is that it spotlights opportunities for members in our community and gives every business an opportunity to support education. One of our teachers received 25 sets of much needed thesauruses and dictionaries; others received 50 5-inch binders, art supplies, digital equipment, and donations for educational classroom trips.

Q: What’s your top advice for parents to help make this a successful school year?

A: For parents in this busy 21st century environment, “schedule” dedicated quality time with their children. Parents should be keenly aware that children are desperate for positive attention from their parents. You can never go back and capture quality time once they are grown.

Also, carve out the time to eat dinner together every day while having conversation, read together every day to establish the importance of literacy, and limit TV/computer time to encourage children to get outside and play.

Q: The Sue West Educator of the Year Award recognizes a teacher with passion and dedication in educating students as well as giving them inspiration to succeed. What is your guiding inspiration for instilling confidence and determination in your students?

A: My guiding inspiration is based upon the premise that learning is a process and a journey that the children and I are on together. I believe in each child and their capacity to learn.

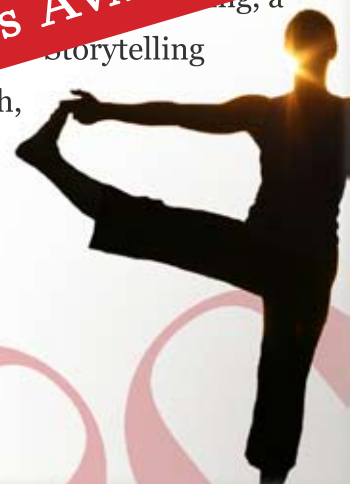

The University of South Carolina Beaufort has announced a new initiative to develop the USCB Performing Arts Center as a regional focal point for theater and the visual arts. This initiative includes the offering of a bachelors of science in studio art beginning January of this year. The performing arts center will host community theatre groups, and will provide a staffed venue for additional performing groups, while expanding use of the visual arts gallery space.

The Hilton Head Island Concours de'Elegance & Motoring Festival was recently featured on the SPEED Channel program "My Classic Car." The episode, which aired on July 25th, celebrated unique cars and their owners and was filmed on location at the 2009 event on Hutchinson Island. It was the second appearance on the program devoted to classic cars and distinctive automobiles.

Hilton Head Island Beaches were recently highlighted in the national publication Tidbits of Hilton Head, Bluffton and Beaufort. The "Tidbits Explores Some Great Beaches" article cited Hilton Head Island's 12 miles of Carolina beachfront, gentle waves and sand dollar-dotted shores. Lowcountry Small Business Hub, Inc. was recently awarded a one-year USDA Rural Development grant totaling \$99,990. Created and launched by the Technical College of the Lowcountry in 2008, the Hub is now an independent non-profit corporation funded in part by a USDA grant, focused on the creation and growth of small businesses in Beaufort, Colleton, Hampton and Jasper counties.

Hilton Head Hospital has received national recognition from the American Association of Respiratory Care for providing first rate respiratory care. The Association's Quality Respiratory Care Recognition (QRCR) recognizes hospitals who meet strict safety and quality standards relating to the provision of respiratory care services by qualified respiratory therapists. Respiratory care services include a pulmonary rehabilitation program for patients with extreme chronic obstruction pulmonary disease.
